A message from the PRCA Manager

March is here and Spring is right around the corner. Work continues on the clubhouse. Pot holes are being filled and the maintenance team is treating the roads as storms come into the area. Taking positive steps forward, we are already preparing for work to begin shortly on the pool, tennis and basketball courts.

Our biggest challenge is the roads. The roads in Pine Ridge are in your hands. In order to get/keep the roads safe, you, as property owners, have to step up and invest in your roads.

The BOD cannot take action without your support. The 5-year plan that I have suggested is as follows:

- 1. Tar and chip to save the roads that are in fair to good shape.
- 2. The other roads would get a scratch coat of asphalt, tar and chip, and then fog sealed (asphalt treatment). Fog sealed has been used in the past to cover Pine Ridge Drive East and West.
- 3. Heavier traveled roads, like the Boulevard, would get approximately 2 ½" of blacktop.
