### **Board of Directors**

First we want to thank everyone that was able to join us for the membership meeting in July. It was helpful to have a large crowd. It is better for us and the community when more residents participate and we are able to listen to a variety of viewpoints. The next **Board meeting will** be August 20th at 10:00 AM, the next Membership meeting will be in November, please try to participate. We all want a better community. Many minds and hands working together is the best way to see real results. During the meeting we had a lot of questions about the gate system. "What is going on with it?!" We wanted to take this opportunity to tell those of you that were not able to attend the meeting.

There are several problems with the gate system. Some of them are...

- 1.) Keypad volume is very low, we need to replace it with a new system that can be heard and used correctly. Right now many residents are pressing nine and hoping it is a visitor they know coming in.
- 2.) Exit gate is rocking causing pins to bend because it was not set into concrete 42" deep.
- 3.) Entrance gates... sensitive to electrical storms because we are using residential line and it is not protected in a conduit.
- 4.)Entrance gates are not properly registering vehicles passing over because the sensors are placed too deep under the ground.
- 5.)Moisture from weather on both the swipe pad and keypad leaves to equipment vulnerable and malfunctioning during and after inclement weather.

We believe, we can fix all this for a cost of approximately \$18,000-\$22,000.

We are not asking the membership for the money to fix these issues, only trying to inform residents of what we are facing. We are not blaming past or present maintenance employees for the improper installation of these systems. They are not experts in community gates or the installation of security gates. We want residents to understand what has happened and know why this time we will be hiring an expert that will sell us the system, install it, and warranty their work. We are looking into several companies. When we get some good options, we plan to talk again the community. We may even ask you to vote on two different options during the September elections. If you have any ideas, questions, or concerns regarding the gate system, now is the time to contact us.

Until we do make all the proper repairs, the gate arms will stay up. We do not want any vehicles damaged or worse yet, anyone injured. Thank you all for your patience and understanding. We are really trying to get this right. We know there are a lot of different opinions about the gate. We want to make as many residents as possible, as comfortable as possible, but safety will remain the top priority.

## Maintenance Department

Dirt Day was a success. Maintenance was able to help over 70 residents with dirt. Homeowners told us they are filling in low areas on their property, making raised garden beds, retaining walls... we listened to many great ideas. # Pool Rules and Reg

#### **Pool Safety Rules Must Be Followed!**

- -Children 15 or under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. If they are not, they will be ejected from the pool.
- -No "rough play" by residents or guest, or any conduct which endangers life or property or interferes with enjoyment of the recreational facilities. You will first get a warning. Then ejected from the pool upon second offense.
- -Congregating around the pool attendants table is not allowed.
- -Pool attendants are the authority regarding the pool and water safety conditions. They must be obeyed.
- -You are not permitted to enter **the pool area without 2022 pool tags and a pool registration form** in our binder. If there is a problem and you do not have one or both of those things, please see Shante in the office. Please **DO NOT harass the pool attendants**, they do not have any additional information. Pool attendants cannot help you understand why your information is not up to date.
- -Do not bring in any small toys to the pool area. If a toy (or detachable part), can fit through a toilet paper tube, leave it home. Do not leave bottle caps lying around or allow children to play with bottle caps in the pool area. We have pulled several small toys and bottle caps out of the pool pump lines. If enough toys go into the plumbing lines, it could destroy our new pumps. Please help us keep the PRCA pool open and running smoothly!
